



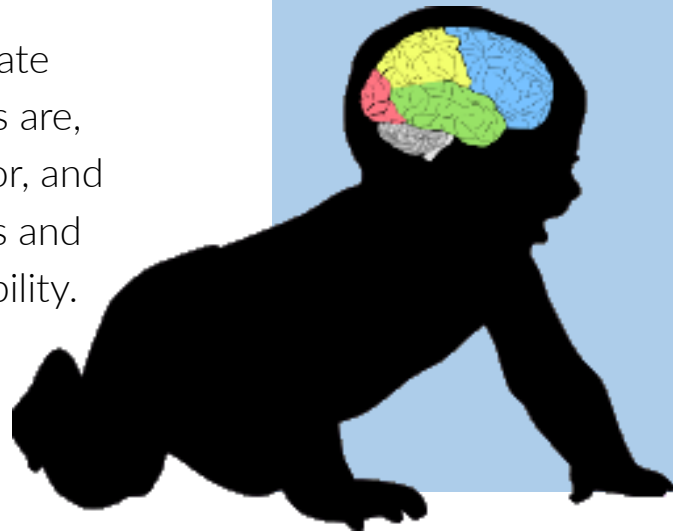
How to Support Young Children with FASDs
