Whether you are traveling to visit other family members, see some local sites you haven't visited, or to just relax, take this time to share new knowledge with your kids. Research shows that people are more eager to learn when they experience it first-and. Since learning also happens outside the walls of a classroom make your tips this summer count. Something as simple as a trip to the post office, can show your kids how mail moves from one place to another. Or talk about the ocean if you are at the coast. If you are traveling a further distance, even the ride there can be a learning experience. Check out some ways to encourage learning while traveling:

Fun ways to learn while in a car, bus, train or plane!

- Look around and describe what you see outside. Read out loud the signs you pass.
 - Ask questions about safety and what different signs mean.
 - Look at a map together and talk about where you are and where you are going. If you on a bus or train see if your child can pick the right line to take.
 - Count the number of stops you make.
 - Tell your child a story of one of your trips, for example, "When I was your age I took the bus to the zoo and i had fun doing..."
 - Play a game like "I Spy."
