Located in 31 elementary catchment areas across the hub region. ○ PRESCHOOL PROMISE – mixed delivery preschool for children whose family is up to 200% of the federal poverty level. Locations are in schools, Tribal, centers, and home-based programs. ○ PARENT EDUCATION – evidence and research-based series parent education.
